Case closed in 1992 with construction of new facilities.

Branson, et. al. v. County of Santa Clara, 1984-86. 1983 to 1986 Main Jail Facilities in San Jose. Federal §1983 Class Action on Totality of Conditions. **Court's Expert and Auditor on Inmate Classification, Segregation Unit Operations, and Inmate Discipline Procedures.**

Fisher v. County of Santa Clara, 1985

Federal §1983 Class Action on Totality of Conditions- Women's Facility. **Court's Expert on Inmate Classification & Inmate Discipline.**

Recent Cases

U.S. District Court Sacramento, CA. 1998 into 2000

A state prisoner being held in county court holding cell, batters county prisoner. As a result of the assault, Plaintiff inmate receives administrative discipline from CDC and new criminal charge. P's claim is to reverse CDC discipline and dismiss criminal charges on grounds County and officers "misclassified" him and that he had to defend himself from the county inmate. Repeated Case filings by inmate plaintiff. Motions for summary judgment granted. County's expert.

U.S. District Court, Southern District of New York, 2000

Plaintiff, a mentally retarded adult is arrested on a N.Y. for escape, is extradited to N.Y. and serves 3 years in maximum security and suffers many

injuries. By accident it is discovered plaintiff is not the subject of the original warrant and has never been arrested. Trial Consultant assisting in discovery items and deposition questions, subsequent expert report for plaintiffs. Significant non-disclosable settlement for plaintiff.

U.S. District Court Sacramento, CA. 2002

Federal Civil Right case involving death of county inmate in city jail holding facility awaiting arraignment. County's trial consultant and declared expert on inmate supervision and court holding facilities standards, assisting in Summary Judgment Statement. Case settled by agreement.

U.S. District Court Sacramento, CA. Court Trial, 2002

County's Defense Expert Witness Federal Civil Rights claim by county transgender prisoner acting pro-per. His claim is that administrative segregation because of his transgender is unconstitutional. Federal Court dismissed the claim after expert testimony.

U.S. District Court Sacramento, CA. 2002

Federal Civil Rights case concerning inmate hanging himself in jail cell 11 days after coming into custody. County's trial consultant and expert on jail procedures and suicide recognition. Report, Deposition, and Summary Judgment Assistance.

U.S. District Court, Fresno, CA. 2003.

Plaintiff arrested on expired warrant of arrest for another latina woman by Sheriff's Deputies. Plaintiff held at county jail w/o medications or attempts to make positive ID. Plaintiff suffered significant medical and psychological damage by incident. Plaintiff's Trial Consultant and Expert Witness on Arrest Procedures, Jail Procedures and Identification Procedures. Report, Deposition

California State Court Monterey, CA. 2003

CDC Inmate is the son of a well known Judge in Monterey County. Plaintiff, a parolee, was severely assaulted by multiple inmates after being placed in general population. Plaintiff Trial Consultant on jail and inmate classification procedures. Opinions and expertise used in settlement negotiations.

Twelfth Judicial District State Court, Montana, 2003

Plaintiff was arrested by City Police and booked for "Disorderly Conduct" (Montana does not allow public intoxication arrests). Plaintiff was semiconscious due to extreme intoxication and a head injury at the time of arrest. He remained unable to care for himself for two days in jail without medical assistance. Plaintiff's trial consultant and expert.

Federal District Court, Indianapolis, IN. 2003

Medium Security DOC Inmate in county jail custody for paternity hearings housed with maximum security, mentally unbalanced county inmate, who stabs him in the eye with a 7" lead pencil. Plaintiff's Expert on Inmate Classification, Jail Procedures, Medical Care, and Inmate Protection, Assistance in Resistance to County Summary Judgment Motion.
